## NOTES:

Traditionally, cold drinks are sold in the refrigerator for 50 cents each. Soda proceeds pay for the Club's free coffee service and cleaning supplies. The brands listed here are suggestions of what is most popular. The Supplies Chair should take advantage of sales and special offers at stores.

The Freedom Club does not have a dishwasher – disposal cups are necessary. It is the Club's experience that small Styrofoam cups are preferable – less coffee is wasted (saving money and trips to the store) and more people can enjoy a pot of coffee at meetings.
